Harvard Professor May Run Bankrupt B&M Railroad

A professor of transportation at Harvard Graduate School of Lusiness Administration was proposed yesterday as the new chief executive officer of the bankrupt Bosion and Maine Ruitroad.

Prof. Paul W. Cherrington would receive an annual salary of \$112,000 and \$8000 to cover fringe henefits under the petition entered in Federal Court by the trustees of the line, Charles W. Bartlett and Robert W. Meserve.

Chercington would succeed John W. Barriger, who is resigning Dec. 31. He is paid \$50,000 annually.

Cherrington, a former assistant secretary in the U. S. Dept. of Transportation, served previously as a trustee for the railroad.

According to the petition, which was opposed by a group of B & M bondholders, Prof. Cherrington played a major role in the line's reorganization plan on file in the court.

Judge Francis J. W. Ford took the petition under advisement.

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
