DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE ON THE BETHLEHEM BRANCH

To Carriers and Tariff Publishing Agents:

The INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION, at a general session held at its office in Washington, D. C., on November 3, 1925, issued the following Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in Finance Docket No. 4549:

"A hearing and investigation of the matters and things involved in this proceeding having been had, and the commission having, on the date hereof, made and filed a report containing its findings of fact and conclusions thereon, which said report is hereby referred to and made a part hereof:

"It is hereby certified, That the present and future public convenience and necessity permit the abandonment by the Boston & Maine Railroad of its so-called Bethlehem branch between Bethlehem Junction and Bethlehem, in Grafton County, N. H., described in the application and report aforesaid.

"It is ordered, That the Boston & Maine Railroad, when filing schedules canceling tariffs applicable on said branch line of railroad, shall in such schedules refer to this certificate by title, date, and docket number.

"It is further ordered, That this certificate shall take effect and be in force from and after 30 days from the date it is issued. Tariffs may be canceled upon notice to the commission and to the general public BY NOT LESS THAN 10 DAYS' FILING AND POSTING in the manner prescribed in Section 6 of the Interstate Commerce Act."

The branch covers the following stations:

- BethlehemN. H.
- MaplewoodN. H.

Service on said branch will be discontinued, effective June 3, 1926. Please arrange to cancel all rates applying on, to, from or via this branch as soon as possible and in so doing, refer to Finance Docket No. 4549 of the Interstate Commerce Commission dated November 3, 1925. If New Hampshire intra-state rates are involved also refer to New Hampshire Public Service Commission Order No. 1790, dated May 7, 1926.
