APPLICATION OF BOSTON AND MAINE RAILROAD FOR CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZING IT TO ABANDON ITS FABYAN BRANCH IN GRAFTON AND COOS COUNTIES, NEW HAMPSHIRE.

Respectfully represents the applicant Boston and Maine Railroad, as follows:

- a. Its full corporate name is BOSTON AND MAINE RAILROAD.
- b. It is a common carrier by railroad subject to the Interstate Commerce Act.
- c. It herewith seeks authority to abandon its so-called Fabyan Branch, which extends approximately 20 miles from its Wing Road station in the County of Grafton to its Base station in the County of Coos, all in the State of New Hampshire.
  - d. Complete abandonment is sought.
  - e. This line is not in receivership.
- f. This line formerly served a resort section in the White Mountains and was operated only during the summer. By the Commission's order of June 15, 1932 in Finance Docket No. 9362, authority was given to abandon its operation and to serve the principal part of the territory over the nearby line of the Maine Central Railroad (184 I.C.C. 593). No service

has been given over the line since that time and no public inconvenience would result if it is now removed.

- h. Applicant is organized under the laws of Maine,

- j. Applicant does not desire a hearing on this application.



DIVISION 4, COMMISSIONERS MEYER, PORTER, AND MAHAFFIE BY DIVISION 4:

The Boston and Maine Railroad, on February 3, 1938, applied for permission to abandon its so-called Fabian branch line of railroad extending from Wing Road to Base, approximately 20.13 miles, all in Grafton and Coos Counties, N.H. No representations have been made by any State authority, and no objection to the application has been offered.

By our report and certificate in Boston & M. R. REPORT OF THE COMMISSION

Pertinent facts with respect to the latter line and the tributary territory are stated in that report. Operation of the line was abandoned on July 15, 1932, and has not been resumed.

The applicant states that the line has not been maintained for several years and is not in condition for operation; that no useful purpose is served by its retention; and that it is now desired to dismantle it before it becomes in such a condition as will make impossible the sending of work trains thereover for the purpose of recovering the useful material for sale or for use elsewhere, of which the estimated net salvage value is \$37,800. The applicant further states that there are no industries in the region except summer resorts and occasional lumbering operations; that there is ample rail service available on other lines for any lumbering; that its Berlin branch is available at a distance of 5 miles for the hotels at Bethlehem; and that those at Twin Mountain, Fabyan, and Bretton Woods are served by trains of the applicant operating under trackage rights over the Maine Central Railroad.

It is apparent from the foregoing that there is no prospective public transportation need of the line proposed to be abandoned, and that its retention would impose an unnecessary and undue burden upon interstate commerce.

We find that the present and future public convenience and necessity permit abandonment by the Boston and Maine Rail-road of the branch line of railroad in Grafton and Coos Counties, N.H., described in the application.
