APPLICATION OF BOSTON AND MAINE RAILROAD FOR CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZING IT TO ABANDON A PORTION OF ITS NEWBURYPORT AND GEORGETOWN BRANCHES IN ESSEX COUNTY, MASSACHUSETTS.

Respectfully represents the applicant, Boston and Maine Railroad, as follows:

- a. Its full corporate name is BOSTON AND MAI E RAILROAD.
- b. It is a common carrier by railroad subject to the Interstate Commerce Act.
- c. It herewith seeks authority to abandon (a) the portion of its so-called Newburyport Branch between its Topsfield and Newburyport stations, a distance of approximately 15.5 miles; and (b) the portion of its so-called Georgetown Branch between its Georgetown station on said Newburyport Branch and its Paper Hill station, a distance of approximately 4.5 miles, both portions of line being entirely in the County of Essex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
  - d. Ahandonment of the lines is sought.
- Their use by the public is very slight and applicant could realize substantial savings by the proposed abandonment.

- g. Applicant is organized under the laws of Maine,
  New Hampshire, Massachusetts and New York, and is authorized
  to do business in Vermont.
- h. The making and filing of this application were authorized by a vote of the Executive Committee of its Board of Directors passed October 8, 1940, a certified copy of which is attached hereto.
- i. Attached hereto is a copy of a situation map showing the lines in question and nearby rail lines. All of said lines are operated as parts of the system of the Boston and Maine Railroad.
