The line in question was constructed in 1874 by the Portsmouth & Dover Railroad Company and acquired by the applicant in 1900. It is laid with 75-pound rail and, with the exception of a small portion thereof, has not been maintained for several years. The net salvage value of recoverable material is \$8,570.
